Together we keep up with the practice of Qur'an recitation at the Madrasah as well as at home since the time spent at the Madrasah is not sufficient to improve their recitation skills. Regular monitoring of the students' progress in a formative way will determine promotion.

TARBIYAH & CODE OF CONDUCT:

To foster core Islamic principles of self-worth, self-discipline and moral conduct, Husayni Madrasah has established rules and regulations. These enhance a good productive learning environment that allows effective learning and builds personality for the students with the final goal of being the followers of the Awaited Savior (atfs).

The Holy Qur'an says. يَا أَيُّهَا الَّذِينَ آمَنُوا قُوا أَنْفُسَكُمْ وَأَهْلِيكُمْ نَارًا [O you who have believed, protect yourselves and your families from a fire...] (Tahreem 66:6)

Tarbiyah (code of conduct) forms the basis of Akhlaq, hence, the HMGS follows the following system for students to accumulate rewarding points of good conduct or being penalized for bad conduct throughout the year.

The Holy Qur'an also says . إِنَّ الْحُسَنَاتِ يُذْهِبْنَ السَّيِّمَاتِ - Indeed, good deeds do away with misdeeds. Hud (11:114)

Each student will be awarded with 100 points to start the year that can be awarded or deducted as follows:

TARBIYAH COMMUNICATION TO PARENTS:

In order to be proactive in your child's successful growth, we may communicate with Parents of any student whose Tarbiyah points fall below 70 by the end of term 1.

The Management strongly discourages bringing of valuable items (e.g. electronics / cash, etc.). The Management shall not be responsible for any stolen / lost items.

AGE CRITERIA

The Husayni Madrasah Girls' Section caters for both male & female students:

Female students (5 to 17 years): Class 1 to 12.

Male students (5 to 11 years): Class 1 to 6

HEALTH EMERGENCY

Husayni Madrasah management takes the health of your child very seriously. In case your child has any allergies or any specific medical condition, kindly let the management know of this during the start of the year. This can be done by specifying it in the registration form or emailing us at https://mags.tabligh@ksijdar.org.

In case your child has non-communicable illnesses (e.g. sport injuries, a fracture, diabetes or on any other medication) and wants to attend Madrasah classes, kindly inform us prior so we can cater for his needs. If a student falls sick during Madrasah classes, the student should inform the management office as soon as possible and the parent/guardian of the student will be contacted.

The Madrasah has limited medical professionals and a first aid kit to give first aid that may be required. In case of emergencies, the child will be rushed to HI-TECH Clinic and the parents will be contacted immediately.

STUDENT LEAVING

In case where a student would like to leave Madrasah in the middle of the academic year, please inform the management in writing at least 1 (one) month prior to the date of leaving. This is to ensure all requirements are met (e.g. Leaving Certificate, handover to madrasah property, etc.). We urge you NOT TO LEAVE in the middle of the academic year.

HYGIENE AND CLEANLINESS

The management would like to ensure parents that a Taahir and clean environment will be present throughout and hence urges the students to maintain the highest level of cleanliness and hygiene. This includes, but is not limited to, clean attire and appearance.

UNIFORM

Hijab is part of a Muslim's practice and plays an important role in expressing love for Islam and showing power in pleasing Allah (swt).

A uniform dress code reinforces pride in the students' appearance and instils recognition of themselves as an integral part of their Madrasah and Islamic community.

ANNUAL PLANNER

The Madrasah Annual Calendar highlights important dates and events in the Madrasah Academic year. Here is the <u>PLANNER</u>. Please take note of the dates when planning your holidays, as we do not offer any assignment or exam re-sits.

MADRASAH CURRICULUM

Classes 1 to 3

ACADEMICS

- On Saturdays, the Tarbiyah syllabus provided by MCE is followed.
- Classes 1, 2, and 3 do not rely on textbooks or written exams. Instead, teachers conduct continuous assessments. Proficiency in language and literacy becomes increasingly important starting from Class 3 onward.

QUR'AN

- On Saturdays, one weekly lesson is dedicated to Qur'an recitation.
- Tuesdays and Thursdays are dedicated to the IQRA Program, designed to facilitate the easy learning and understanding of Arabic letters and the recitation of the Holy Qur'an. Additionally, Tarbiyah lessons, along with Qur'an recitation, are conducted twice a month.

Classes 4 to 6

ACADEMICS

- HMGS has adopted the Tarbiyah Syllabus from Madrasah Centre of Excellence (MCE) under World Federation.
- The Tarbiyah syllabus is based on Quranic worldview, our approach is integrated (incorporates all our core subjects: Qur'an, Aqaid, Tarikh and Akhlaq), learner-centered, and focused on "nurturing piety" in our students.
- Lessons are categorized as Tarbiyah 1, Tarbiyah 2 and Tarbiyah 3 (for Classes 5 and 6).
- Weekly assignments that are based on "Faith in Action" extend the lessons and encourage practical application of what students learn beyond the Madrasah. We will assign 13 14 assignments per term of which 10 best grades of the assignments will be used for the term grade.
- Exams will be conducted for Tarbiyah 1 (50 marks), Tarbiyah 2 (50 marks), Tarbiyah 3 (class 5 & 6, 50 marks), and assignments (50 marks).

QUR'AN

- We dedicate one lesson every week to Qur'an Recitation and urge the parents to follow up with continuous practice over the week. Efficiency of recitation can only be achieved through practice. Qur'an recitation is done in small groups progressing by use of the Qur'an Manuals to recitation of the big Qur'an.
- **Qur'an Manuals**: Students are provided with Manuals from Levels 1 to 4. These are Madrasah property and must be returned at the end of the year. If a Manual is lost or torn, the parent is

required to purchase another to replace it. We are currently in the process of introducing Level 5 book soon.

Classes 7 to 10

ACADEMICS

- In 2024, Classes 7 to 10 will adhere to the HMGS Syllabus, with a transition to the MCE Tarbiyah curriculum scheduled for 2025. Academic subjects will include Q114 & Akhlaq, Islamic History, and Dinyat (Fiqh & Aqa'id), with end-of-term exams for each.
- Each subject is divided into two terms, during which students will submit a take-home assignment.
- Marks for each subject will be distributed as follows:
 - 30% on Written assessments.
 - 20% on Take Home assignments.

QUR'AN

On Saturdays, one weekly lesson is dedicated to Qur'an recitation.

Classes 11 & 12

 Students will undergo eight separate modules over the year - four during the first term and four during the second. Each module will assess students on the knowledge gained during the course by allocating 50 marks.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS AND ACADEMIC STANDARDS: GRADING, PASSING MARKS, AND EXAM POLICIES

- Awards are given for an Overall 'A' Grader.
- Classes 4 12: A Grade is 81% and above.
- The passing mark for classes 4 12 is 40%.
- The Madrasah does not offer supplementary exams or early exams. It is the responsibility of the student to make up for any missed percentage in other modules in the case of excused exam absence.
- Students in classes 11 and 12 have to attend all exams and pass all modules to qualify for graduation.

LEARNING SUPPORT

The Husayni Madrasah understands that every student learns differently and at their own pace. For students who require additional support to reach their full potential, we offer a personalized Learning Support (LS) program.

What is LS?

LS provides students with individualized attention and tailored learning plans to address their specific needs. This goes beyond what can be offered in the regular classroom setting, where diverse needs require a more flexible approach.

How does LS benefit students?

- Focused support: LS teachers work closely with students to identify areas for improvement and develop strategies to help them achieve the goals.
- Individualized learning: Personalized plans cater to each student's unique learning style and pace, ensuring they receive the support they need to succeed.
- Parental involvement: LS teachers collaborate with parents to ensure consistent support both at Madrasah and at home.

Together, we can help all students achieve their academic and spiritual goals. If you have any questions about the LS program, please don't hesitate to contact the Management.

EXTRACURRICULAR EVENTS

The Madrasah occasionally takes classes on field trips relevant to topics in the curriculum. Parents will be informed in advance about these trips and students will only be allowed to participate after a signed consent is received from the parents.

The Madrasah's student council, the Development Society, will organize activities for students. Please make sure that your child actively participates in these activities to promote positive social interactions. You will be required to sign a consent agreement to allow your child's participation for these events.

STUDENT-PARENT-TEACHER MEETINGS AND COFFEE SESSIONS

Parents are welcome to make an appointment with the HOD/management, through the Administrator to discuss their child's progress. Arrangements can be made to talk to the teachers if need arises.

In addition, Husayni Madrasah organizes at least 1 formal Student/ Parent/Teacher (PTC) meeting in the academic year. The meeting is designed to discuss your child's progress and your participation/cooperation.

Furthermore, the Husayni Madrasah provides a platform on regular basis for parents to propose general suggestions and discuss issues. We strongly encourage parents' attendance and participation for collective development.
